Tourism Development Grants support Clackamas County Tourism's mission to assist our local communities and organizations through effective tourism asset development. Development Grants are open to public, private and nonprofit organizations whose project benefits the greater public interests of tourism development. \$250,000 is available for Development Grants in FY19/20. The minimum award is \$5,000. The Tourism Development Council may award up to \$250,000 for a project.

Development Grant FY19/20 Timeline

- August 7 & 27* – Development Grant Workshop (*required attendance for new grant applicants*): Contact [Aaron](#) to RSVP or if you are unable to attend on either of these dates.
- September 18 – Pre-Applications due
- October 30 – Full Application due
- November – Grant Advisory Panel reviews application packets
- December - Tourism Development Council (TDC) decides funding
